A better understanding of inequality as well as new paradigms, strategies and a renewed political will for 'leaving no one behind' are required. **Structural equity policies** at all levels throughout the education system, as well as **extraordinary measures** when needed, should **ensure that students from any background with the potential to succeed are fully integrated with equal opportunities into higher education**.

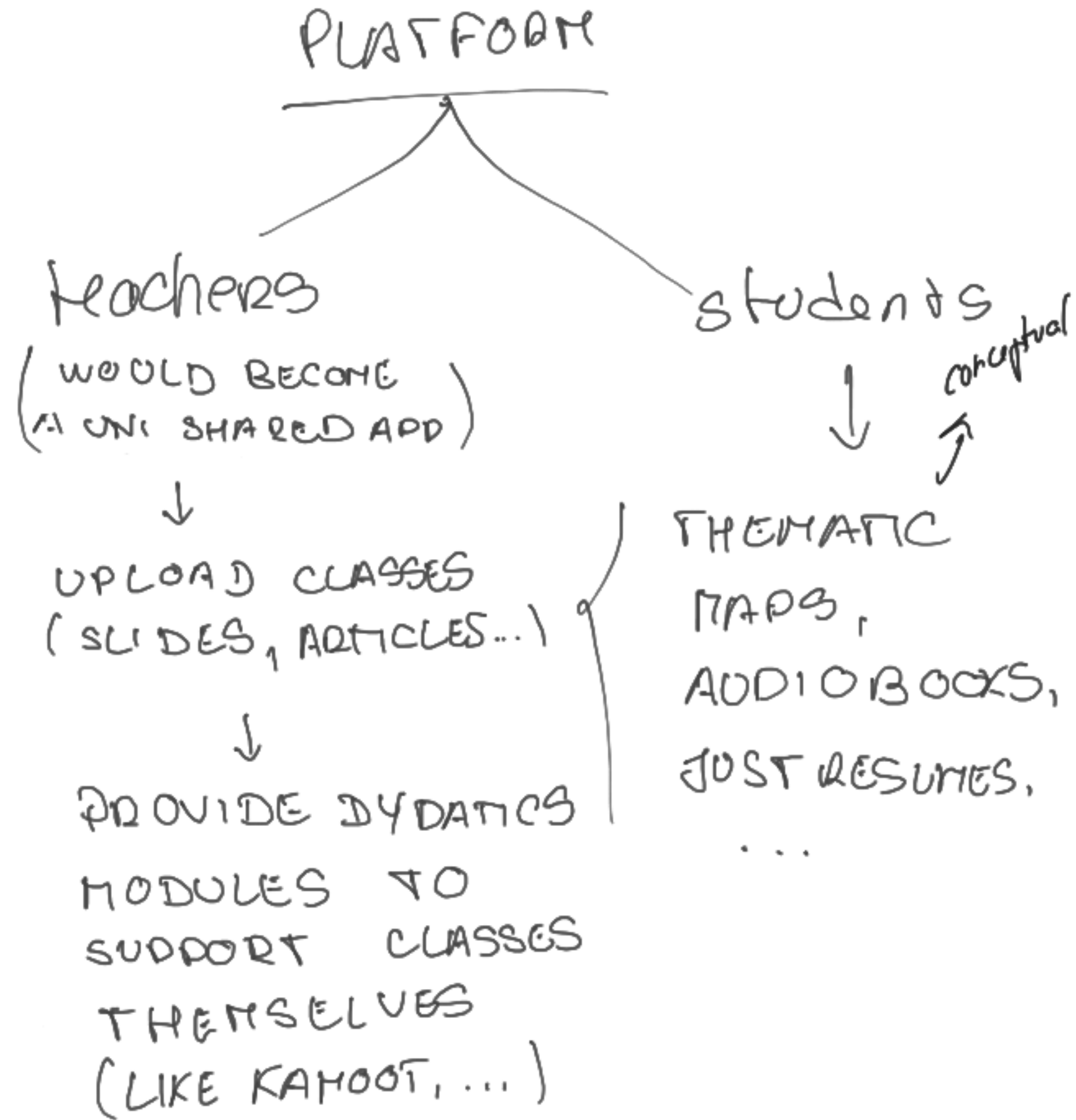
- ebooks and audiobooks (audible)
