Yet **significant barriers remain for many vulnerable groups**. A better understanding of inequality as well as new paradigms, strategies and a renewed political will for 'leaving no one behind' are required. **Structural equity policies** at all levels throughout the education system, as well as **extraordinary measures** when needed, should **ensure that students from any background with the potential to succeed are fully integrated with equal opportunities into higher education**.

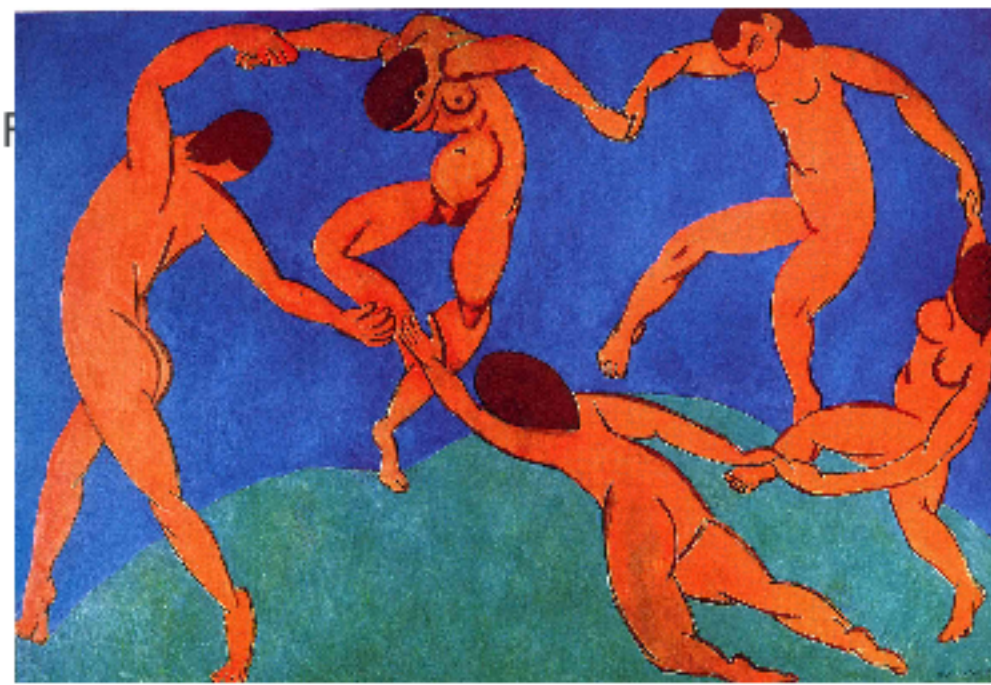

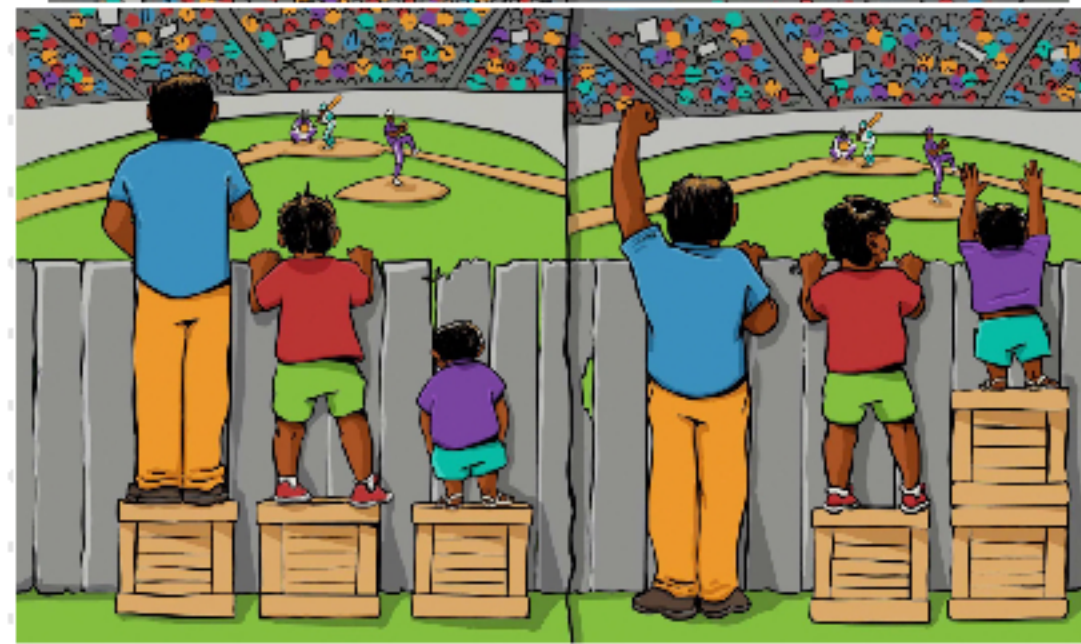

Peer to peer education, a kind of help: to help one another to complete a common good.

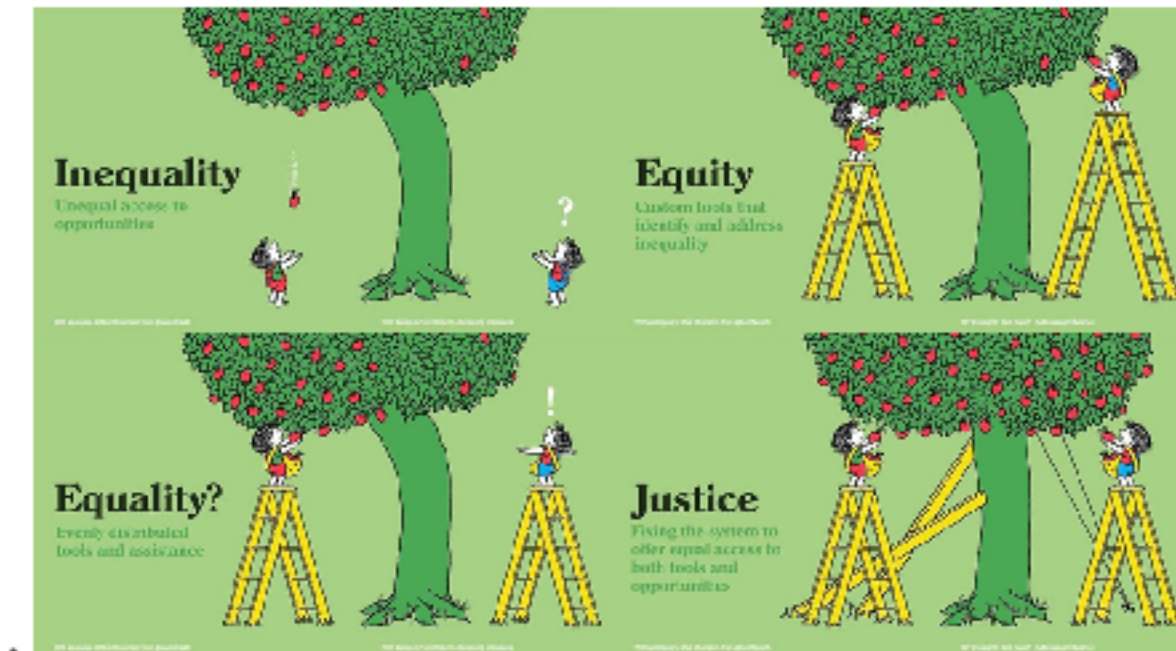


Inclusion, in a way, means people being involved and being equal, with the help of equity. Inequalities could e.g. be because of gender, beliefs, culture...

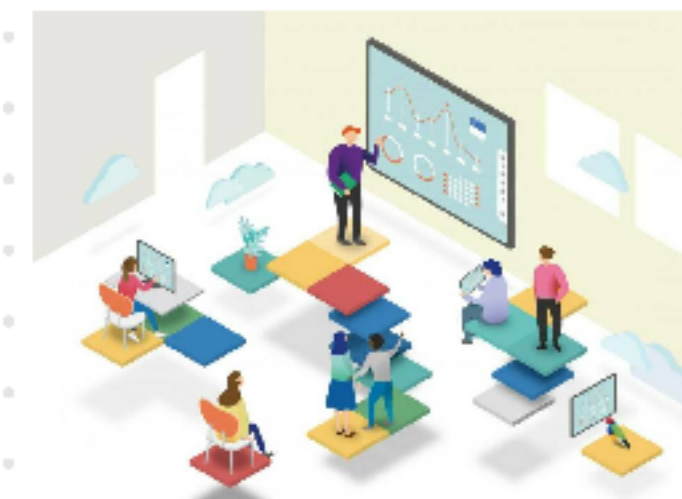
